# Directory of Printed, Regional Newspapers of Puerto Rico: 2022 Update and Applications to Research<sup>1</sup>

Abstract: Together with traditional and social media, printed regional newspapers are useful means to disseminate knowledge to a broad readership and engage people in research. An updated directory of Puerto Rican printed regional newspapers is provided. During 2022, ten printed, regional newspapers circulated in the island continuing their decreasing trend in total number.

Key Words: directory regional newspapers, Puerto Rico, research, public education, Nathan Leopold

#### Introduction

Through my career, I have enjoyed profoundly sharing news about my research interests with the broader public. Earlier in my career, I appeared on television shows, participated on radio interviews, distributed flyers, and wrote articles for magazines directed to a broader audience, as well as for national and regional newspapers. In addition to those more traditional venues, in recent decades I have also used social media (e.g., Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, Twitter, etc.) to spread news of interest to me.

Occasionally, some of my research interests bring me back to Puerto Rico, where my career began many decades ago. In the early 1980's, I needed to disseminate a request for help in getting me specimens of the group I was studying, the scorpions of the Greater Puerto Rico Region (Santiago-Blay 1984). I used every broadcasting venue available to me and was successful in spreading the word about my work. Consequently, my collecting efforts were multiplied rapidly thanks to the generosity of other people. However, when it came to the regional newspapers, I had little to rely on besides two scholarly references about Puerto Rican newspapers (Pedreira 1969, Romeu 1985) that, as far as I could tell, did not address the regional newspapers phenomenon. Thus, back in 1983, I endeavored to compile such directory, which was published several years later (Santiago-Blay 1989/1990) and updated it some twenty years later (Santiago-Blay 2003).

Currently, I am collaborating in a research project on a small chapter in the history of science, the life of Nathan Freudenthal Leopold (1904, Chicago

Illinois, USA to 1971, San Juan, Puerto Rico) in Puerto Rico (1958-1971). Leopold was a precocious scientist who was already published as an adolescent! In 1924, his life changed dramatically as he and his partner in crime and love, Richard Loeb, were sentenced to life plus 99 years for the murder and kidnap, respectively, Robert (Bobby) Franks, a 14-year young boy. Leopold spent over 33 years in prison and returned to the life of doing science in Puerto Rico from 1958 until his death in 1971 (Fiorini 2013; Rebain 2023, in press). What better way to, once more, include regional newspapers, to inform the broad public of this project and perhaps garner a few contacts who may remember Leopold?

### Directory of Printed Regional Newspapers of Puerto Rico that Circulated in Puerto Rico during 2022

Herein, I include an updated directory of regional newspapers of Puerto Rico that circulated during 2022, listed in strict alphabetical order. Only those newspapers that appeared in printed form are listed. Online newspapers only are excluded.

This directory follows this template: 1) Year when the newspaper was founded. 2) Current format of the newspaper, if a digital version of the printed version is known digital, the URL is provided. 3) Frequency of the newspaper, whether weekly or biweekly; the number of printed copies typically produced, and the geographical area where the printed version of the regional circulates. If the specific municipalities where the printed version of the newspapers are reported to circulate, they are listed in alphabetical order. 4) Name of a contact person. 5) Contact information for communication.

All the newspapers herein listed are written almost completely in Spanish, are available free of charge, and have a strong digital social media presence (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Instagram).

The information rendered in this directory was obtained through phone calls or the web and confirmed via phone calls and/or emails during May 2022 and/or December 2022.

Comments: This is the oldest regional newspaper currently circulating in Puerto Rico. It has a subtitle, "El Regional con Fuerza Nacional", the regional [newspaper] with national strength or presence.

Comments: Two versions of this newspaper circulate in Puerto Rico: one in western Puerto Rico, called Periódico Visión Oeste; the other in northern Puerto Rico, called *Periódico Visión Norte*. The printed version of *Visión* for western (Oeste) Puerto Rico has a typical circulation of approximately 66,000 copies in the municipalities of Aguadilla, Aguada, Añasco, Cabo Rojo, Hormigueros, Isabela, Lajas, Mayagüez, Moca, Rincón, Sabana Grande, San Germán, San Sebastián, and Yauco. The printed version of Visión for northern (Norte) Puerto Rico has a typical circulation of approximately 40,000 copies in the

municipalities of Arecibo, Berceloneta, Florida, Morovis, Camuy, Hatillo, Quebradillas, Lares, Utuado, Manatí, and Vega Baja.

#### Discussion




Figure 1. Number of printed, regional newspapers circulating in Puerto Rico approximately every twenty years, beginning with 1983. In Santiago-Blay (1989/1990, 2003), I reported 26 and 13 newspapers for 1983 and 2003, respectively. However, I overlooked three printed regional newspapers in each 1983 and 2003 (Multiple authors no date), hence a number closer to the truth for 1983 is 29 and for 2003 is 16.

The number of printed regional newspapers has decreased for the second time in each of the approximately 20 years between the publication of the directories (Figure 1). The downturn of the Puerto Rican economy in recent decades, natural disasters (e.g., Hurricane María), and greater reliance in obtaining news from the internet may have contributed to this decline. The area of circulation of the newspapers continues being nearly the entire island (75 out of the 78 municipalities of Puerto Rico). The only exceptions I have detected are the municipalities of Jayuya, Las Marías, and Maricao, located in the mountains of central Puerto Rico, where no regional newspapers appears to target them. The headquarters of printed regional newspapers overwhelmingly continue being located in larger metropolitan areas. All printed, regional newspapers in Puerto Rico are filled with advertisements. The gender abyss in the top leadership continues, with men at the helm in most (8 out of 10) printed, regional newspapers in Puerto Rico.

Perhaps, the most notable change in printed, regional Puerto Rican newspapers is that all of them have a presence on the web and, at least, one of them, Periódico La Perla del Sur, is available only in digital version.

Together with more traditional printed insular newspapers and, more recently, social media, regional newspapers are useful methods to disseminate news of interest to a broad readership and to engage readers in useful activities
